<u>Freedom Riders (2011)</u> - For six months in 1961, over 400 amazing individuals risked their lives by travelling by bus and train through the Deep South to challenge Jim Crow laws and segregation. Available for purchase <u>here.</u>

<u>Wadjda (2012)</u> - Wadjda is a girl living in Saudi Arabia who wants a bike, but her mom won't buy her a one since the mainstream culture frowns upon girls riding bikes. <u>Bicycle Thieves (1948)</u> - This Italian classic tells the simple, beautiful story of a working class man in pursuit of his stolen bicycle. <u>The Triplets of Belleville (2003)</u> - This award-winning animated French comedy follows Madame Souza as she tracks down her grandson, who has been kidnapped by the mafia for the Tour de France race. <u>Rising from Ashes (2012)</u> - Rising from Ashes tells the inspirational story of Rwanda's first cycling team as they prepare to compete in the Tour de France while their country recovers from a genocide campaign.
