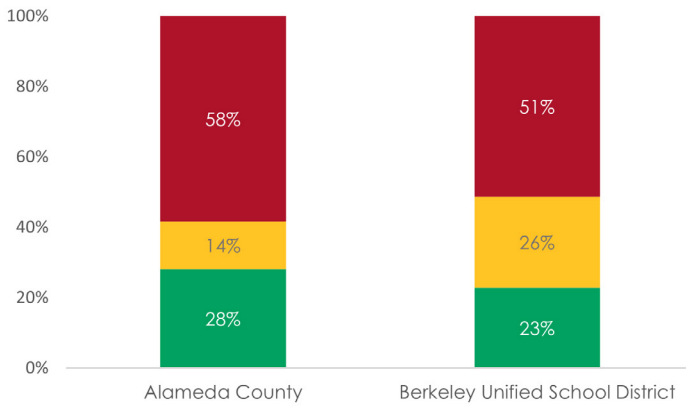

Top Reasons to Walk or Bike

Barriers to Walking/Biking to School

- Bad weather (33%)
- It takes too long to walk or bike to school (24%)
- Driving is more convenient (14%)
- Lack of facilities (no sidewalks, bike paths or routes; sidewalks or bike routes are not continuous or are in need of repair; street crossings are unsafe) (5%)
