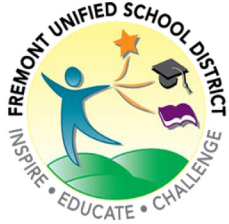

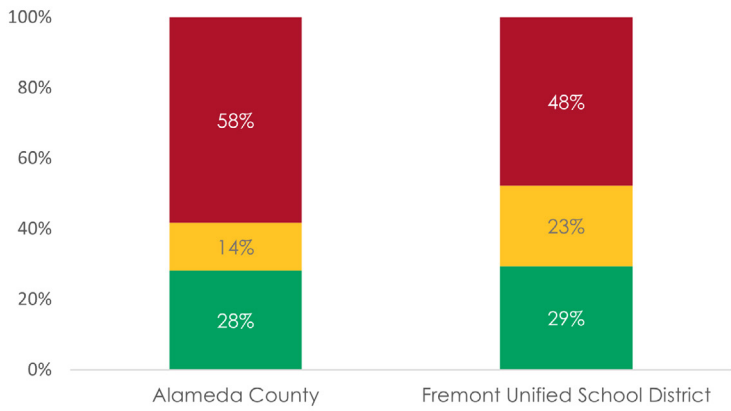

Parent/Caregiver Feedback

The following are the top responses to questions in the spring 2024 Parent/Caregiver Surveys. These results are aggregated for the entire School District due to varying response rates from individual schools.

Top Reasons to Walk or Bike

- Walking and biking encourage an active, healthy lifestyle (55%)
- Walking and biking are fun for my family/ household (15%)
- Other (11%)
- None of the above – I'm not interested in walking and biking (6%)

Barriers to Walking/Biking to School

- Poor driving behavior on streets near school (distracted driving, speeding, not yielding at crosswalks) (16%)
- Bad weather (15%)
- Lack of adult presence/supervision (adults to travel with, crossing guards) (13%)
- It takes too long to walk or bike to school (13%)
