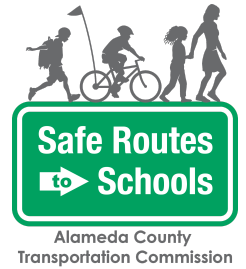




Ongoing Walk and Roll April



Theme: Nature Appreciation

Below are activities to keep us moving and appreciate nature in the month of April.

Activities your child or students might want to do before your walk and roll event:

Activities your child might want to do during your walk and roll event:

- Print [this scavenger hunt](#) to use for students to guide them on their walk to explore their community and home
- During your child's walk, ask them what they appreciate about nature and their community surroundings. Ask them to think about what are different bugs, plant life, and climate changes they are noticing in the month of April.
- Ask students to share their favorite place in nature. Have them go into detail and visualize what their favorite place in nature looks like, feels like, and smells like. Talk to students about why this place is so special to them.
