Media and Communications

Please use the following information to stay up-todate on Bike to the Moon Week, and to promote this non-competitive, encouragement event.

Event at a Glance

- What: A countywide virtual event to encourage students to walk, bike, skate, scoot, and learn about bike safety education. Schools have the option to host an in-person Bike to School Day too. Participants track their activities to collectively travel the distance from Earth to the moon.
- Why: Reduce pollution and congestion, stay healthy, build community, and keep our streets safe.
- When: One week, from Monday, May 9 Friday, May 13, 2022. The registration deadline
 for schools is Friday, April 22.
- Where: Throughout Alameda County
- Who: Students of all ages from schools enrolled in the Alameda County SR2S Program, and school staff, parents, and community members.
- How: Do any kind of physical activity bike, walk, scoot, skateboard - and learn about bike safety. Track your miles or minutes of activity daily, or at the end of the week, using the Moon Miles Tracker. We will convert your activity to Moon Miles. Submit your activity by 5:00pm on Monday, May 16, 2022.

Participation Incentives

Every participating student will receive a fun giveaway. Elementary school students will receive a reflective sticker for their helmet or bike. Middle school students will receive bike lights. High school students will receive tote bags, courtesy of Bike East Bay.

Track Event Progress

During the event, you can monitor our progress to the moon on **Facebook** and **Twitter**. The following information will be available daily:

- Number of schools participating
- Number of "moon miles" traveled.

Note: This information will only reflect partial participation information, and only captures those participants that enter their activity daily. We won't have all participant information until after May 16th.

Speaking Notes

Event Purpose

The purpose of Bike to the Moon Week is to encourage students, families, classrooms, and school communities to bicycle, skate, scoot, use an assisted mobility device, or use other non-motorized transportation. Participants will track their miles or minutes of activity in an effort to collectively reach the moon – 286,900 miles away.

Event Location

Participants can use these modes of travel to go to school or to enjoy on their neighborhood streets.

COVID Safety Protocol

This event is primarily virtual, but schools have the option to host an in-person Bike to School Day in addition to Bike to the Moon Week. Due to COVID restrictions, on-site visits from media and elected officials are at the discretion of the school and their visitor policies.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Alameda County Safe Routes to School Program?

The Alameda County Safe Routes to Schools (SR2S) Program is a countywide program that organizes and supports fun, educational activities that encourage families to walk, bike, carpool, and take transit to school. It is funded by Alameda CTC and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission. Over 260 public schools in Alameda County are enrolled, as of August 2021.

Are all schools in Alameda County enrolled?

Participation in the Alameda County SR2S Program is open to, but entirely optional for, all public schools in Alameda County. For enrolled schools, all programming and events are voluntary. How many schools are enrolled in the program?

Over 260 schools, ranging from elementary to middle to high schools, are enrolled as of August 2021.

What other events does the Alameda County Safe Routes to School Program organize?

The Alameda County Safe Routes to School Program hosts many other events and activities for schools. Other big countywide events are:

- International Walk and Roll to School Day (October)
- High school event (winter season)
- Golden Sneaker Contest (February/March)

Additional activities are held on a school-by-school basis. Activities include:

- Ongoing Walk and Roll to School Days
- School Safety Assessments
- Suggested routes to school maps
- Drive Your Bike 101 and 102
- The BikeMobile
- Pedestrian Rodeos
- Bike Rodeos
- Music Notes
- Travel Training
- And more



How does this event work?

Participants will track their daily miles or minutes of activities from May 9 through 13, and enter them into the Bike to the Moon Week mileage tracker.

Daily updates on mileage will be posted on Alameda County Safe Routes to Schools' Facebook and Twitter.

Are media welcome to participate in-person or oncampus?

Any in-person visit to a school is at the school's discretion.


Is this event only for students?

Is this event only for bicycling?


This event is open to bicycling, walking, using a wheelchair, skateboarding, and scooting!
