### **Event at a Glance**

- Who: Students of all ages from schools enrolled in the Alameda County SR2S Program.
- What: A countywide event to encourage students to walk, bike, skate, scoot, take shared transportation, and other active modes of travel
- When: Wednesday, October 4, 2023, usually between 7 and 8AM (depending on school hours)
- » Where: Multiple schools throughout Alameda County.
- Why: To encourage students to use active modes of transportation for healthy kids, safer streets, and strong communities.

# If I'm not able to participate during this event, can I participate in other Safe Routes to Schools events?

## Does every school in Alameda County participate in this event?

No, only schools who are registered for the Alameda County Safe Routes to Schools program are able to participate. Over 290 elementary, middle, and high schools are registered in the program. Of those schools, elementary and middle schools opt in to participating in the Golden Sneaker Contest.
