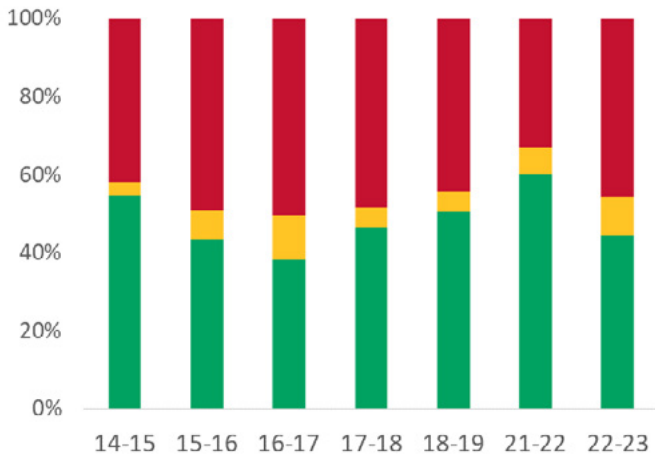

## Parent/Caregiver Feedback

The following are the top responses to questions in the spring 2023 Parent/Caregiver Surveys. These results are aggregated for the entire School District due to varying response rates from individual schools.

### Top Reasons to Walk or Bike

- Walking and biking encourage an active, healthy lifestyle (42%)
- Walking and biking are fun for my family/ household (23%)
- Reducing driving minimizes crashes and congestion (12%)
- Other (8%)
