

### Parent/Caregiver Feedback

The following are the top responses to questions in the spring 2023 Parent/Caregiver Surveys. These results are aggregated for the entire School District due to varying response rates from individual schools.

### Top Reasons to Walk or Bike

- Walking and biking encourage an active, healthy lifestyle (38%)
- Other (17%)
- Walking and biking are fun for my family/ household (11%)
- Driving causes air pollution
- which harms the environment and our health (9%)

#### Barriers to Walking/Biking to School

- Poor driving behavior on streets near school (distracted driving, speeding, not yielding at crosswalks) (21%)
- Concerns about personal safety (stranger danger, gangs, violence or dogs) (11%)
- It takes too long to walk or bike to school (14%)
- Driving is more convenient (12%)
