Event Description

International Walk and Roll to School Day

(IWR2SD) is an annual event held by schools across the world to encourage students, caregivers, and the school community to walk, roll, or use other active modes of transportation to get to school.

This year, the event will be held on **Wednesday**, **October 9, 2024**. For over a decade, hundreds of schools across Alameda County have participated in this annual countywide celebration. The Safe Routes to Schools program has many tools to help you plan a successful event.

Celebrate and Encourage Walking and Rolling to School

We should celebrate and encourage because walking and rolling...

- » Can create safer environments around schools.
- » Can help reduce 40% of transportation-related CO² emissions
- » Can reduce 20% of morning traffic congestion around schools
- » Can help students achieve 60 minutes of daily exercise, as recommended by the Center for Disease Control.

Giveaway gifts for students








Event Timeline

Here's a suggested timeline to help you plan and promote your event. This can be customized to the needs of your school and the scale of the event you have planned. More planning resources, flyer templates, and printable materials are <u>located online</u>.



Event Promotion

Ways to Get the Word Out:

- » Put the <u>IWR2SD newsletter template</u> in your school newsletter.
- » Send flyers home
- » Post flyers in your school
- » Encourage students to make signs
- » Post the electronic flyer online
- » Announce IWR2SD in your school newsletter. Ask classroom teachers to add a blurb in their school newsletters or their weekly memos
- » Post the event on school marquee
- » Notify teachers and the PTA via staff announcements







Social Media Posts

Social media is a great way to reach students, teachers, and the broader community quickly and frequently. We've put together instructions and a few sample posts that you can use to promote the event. We suggest using them on your school or personal social media accounts.

Spread the word!

How to Post

1. <u>Download images</u> from the International Walk and Roll to School Day webpage and save images to your desktop

2. Log on to your social media site such as Facebook or Twitter

3. Copy and past the sample post text into your status update, or create your own message that includes the #walkandroll24 and #IWR2SD hashtags

4. Upload the image you saved to your desktop to accompany your status update

5. Post your status update!

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

How early should volunteers arrive at school?

Forty-five minutes gives volunteers ample time to set up for the event.

What if we want to have this event during a different date?

You can have this event at a date that works for your school and write the date of the event on the posters.

How will materials be distributed?

Materials will be distributed at your Task Force meeting. If you are unable to attend an in-person meeting or your meeting is virtual, your coordinator will designate a spot for you to pick up materials.

What if I am unable to attend the Task Force meeting?

We will record task force meetings so that you have all of the information that you need. You can also always reach out to your coordinator with any additional questions.

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
