Event Description

International Walk and Roll to School Day

(IWR2SD) is an annual event held by schools across the world to encourage students, caregivers, and the school community to walk, roll, or use other active modes of transportation to get to school.

This year, the event will be held on **Wednesday**, **October 8**, **2025**. For over a decade, hundreds of schools across Alameda County have participated in this annual countywide celebration. The Safe Routes to Schools Program has many tools to help you plan a successful event.

This toolkit provides school champions, staff, volunteers, and parents the resources needed to plan, prepare, and have a successful IWR2SD event!

Celebrate and Support Walking and Rolling to School

Encouraging students to walk or roll to school benefits everyone. Here's how:

- » Improves safety around school zones by reducing vehicle traffic.
- » Cuts transportation-related CO² emissions by up to 40%, contributing to a healthier environment.
- **Eases morning congestion,** reducing traffic near schools by as much as 20%.
- » Promotes physical activity, helping students get the recommended 60 minutes of daily exercise, as advised by the CDC.










Event Timeline

Here's a suggested timeline to help you plan and promote your event. This can be customized to the needs of your school and the scale of the event you have planned. More planning resources, flyer templates, and printable materials are located online.



Event Promotion

Ways to Get the Word Out:

- » Put the <u>IWR2SD newsletter</u> template in your school newsletter.
- » Send <u>flyers</u> home with students.
- » Post flyers in and around your school.
- » Encourage students to make signs for the day of the event.
- » Post the electronic flyer online.
- » Announce IWR2SD in your school newsletter. Ask classroom teachers to add a blurb in their school newsletters or their weekly memos.
- » Post the event on the school marquee.
- » Notify teachers and the PTA via staff announcements.







Social Media Posts

Social media is a great way to reach students, teachers, and the broader community quickly and frequently. We've put together instructions and a few sample posts that you can use to promote the event. We suggest using them on your school or personal social media accounts.

How to Post

- 1. **Download images** and save images to your desktop.
- 2. Log on to your social media site such as Facebook, Instagram, or X (formerly known as Twitter).
- 3. Copy and past the sample post text into your post, or create your own message that includes the #walkandroll25 and #IWR2SD hashtags.
- 4. Upload the image you saved to your desktop to accompany your post.
- 5. Publish your post!

How early should volunteers arrive at school?

Forty-five minutes gives volunteers ample time to set up for the event.

What if we want to have this event on a different date?

You can have this event on a different date if that works better for your school. Just write the date of the event on your posters.

How will materials be distributed?

Materials will be distributed at your <u>Task Force</u> meeting. If you are unable to attend an in-person

meeting or your meeting is virtual, your site coordinator will designate a spot for you to pick up materials.

What if I am unable to attend the Task Force meeting?

We will record task force meetings so that you have all of the information you need. You can always reach out to your coordinator with any additional questions.


Additional Safe Routes to Schools Activities
