During the Golden Sneaker Contest, the Alameda County Safe Routes to Schools (SR2S) team challenges students, classrooms, and schools to compete to see who can walk, roll, carpool, and/or use public transit the most. Contest coordinators will promote the event in advance of the contest by posting flyers, adding to school announcements and newsletters, posting to social media, or creating video advertisements.
